THE HANUKKAH ANTHOLOGY BY PHILLIP GOODMAN

Miracles for a Broken Planet

Hanukkah is the Festival of Lights. It commemorates an ancient Jewish rebellion against oppression, during which the Temple in Jerusalem was miraculously recaptured from pagan hellenizers and rededicated to the worship of God. The candles of Hanukkah celebrate that rededication. They also help brighten the long winter nights.

But I remember a Hanukkah when darkness almost overpowered the light.

It was the first week of November 1938. The final years of the Depression lay like a polluting mist across the streets of New York. On afternoons when it did not rain I would play on the sidewalk in front of the plateglass window of the candy store near our apartment house. The bubble of darkness on the other side of the world bumped only vaguely against my consciousness.

I was very young then, interested more in Flash Gordon and Buck Rogers than Adolf Hitler.

One afternoon I was near the candy store, in the cardboard box that was my rocket ship, when an elderly couple walked slowly by; I caught some of the frightened words. Before supper that evening I saw my mother standing over the kitchen sink, her head bowed, and heard her whispering agitatedly to herself. Later, my father came home from work, drenched in weariness; he turned on the radio and became wearier still.

That night I lay awake in my bed and saw the pieces of the day come together and form a portrait of terror.

A Jewish boy had shot a German, the old people had said. We will pay dearly for it, very dearly.

The boy had been sent by his parents to live with his uncle in Paris, my father had murmured. Then his parents were deported to Poland.

The boy went out of his mind, my mother had said in a voice full of fear. He did not know what he was doing.

He wanted to kill the German ambassador, my father had said. He wanted the world to know about the suffering of Germany's Jews. Inside the embassy he made a mistake and shot and wounded a subordinate instead.

He was out of his head with grief, my mother has said. He could not have known what he was doing.

I lay very still in my bed, thinking of the boy who had shot the German and wondering what the Germans would do to the Jews. Two days later the subordinate died.

In the weeks that followed I dreamed about the synagogues that were burning all over Germany, about the Jews who were being sent to concentration camps, about the looted stores and smashed shop-windows. One day I stood in front of our apartment house and imagined our street littered with glass, shattered glass everywhere, the plate-glass window of the candy store splattered across the sidewalk, the store itself burned and gutted. I imagined the entire block, the neighborhood, the city heaped with broken glass and thick with stench of fire. The days of that November and December began to go dark, until it seemed all the world would soon be shades of darkness: dark sun and dark moon, dark sky and dark earth, dark night and dark day. I was a child then, but I still remember that darkness as a malevolence I could touch and smell, an evil growth draining my world of its light.

My world seemed thick with darkness when Hanukkah came that year on the twenty-fifth of December.

I remember my father chanting the blessings over the first candle on the night of the first night of the festival. He was short and balding, and he chanted in a thin, intense voice. I stood between him and my mother, gazing at the flame of the first night's candle. The flame seemed pitiful against the malignant darkness outside our window. I went to bed and was cold with dread over the horror of the world.

The next night two candles were lighted. Again my father chanted the blessings before the lighting and the prayer that follows when the candles are burning: "We kindle these lights on account of the miracles, the deliverances, and the wonders which Thou didst work for our fathers....We are only to look at them, in order that we may give thanks unto Thy Name for Thy Miracles, Thy deliverances and Thy wonders."

I wanted a miracle. But there were no miracles during that Hanukkah. Where was God? I kept dreaming of burning synagogues.

On the eighth and final night of the festival I stood with my parents in front of the burning candles. The darkness mocked their light. I could see my parents glancing at me. My mother sighed. Then my father murmured my name.

"You want another miracle?" he asked wearily.

I did not respond.

"Yes," he said. "You want another miracle." He was silent a moment. Then he said, in a gentle, urging voice, "I also want another miracle. But if it does not come, we will make a human miracle. We will give the world the special gifts of our Jewishness. We will not let the world burn out our souls."

The candles glowed feebly against the dark window.

"Sometimes I think man is a greater miracle-maker than God," my father said tiredly, looking at the candles. "God does not have to live day after day on this broken plant. Perhaps you will learn to make your own miracles. I will try to teach you how to make human miracles."

I lay awake a long time that night and did not believe my father could ever teach me that. But now, decades later, I think he taught me well. And I am trying to teach it to my own children.

HANUKKAH H©W-T©

Hanukkah is a festival of light, of miracles and of celebration. And like many of the Jewish holidays, it is celebrated primarily in our homes. This year, Hanukkah begins on the evening of Thursday, December 10.

We have all heard the story of this eight-day festival, which commemorates the rededication of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem after the Maccabean Jews' victory over the Hellenist Syrians in 165 BCE. We remember the miracle of a tiny flask of oil that kept the Temple's great menorah burning for not one, but eight days, until more purified oil could be obtained.

I understand that this year is different. Extended families will not be gathering and our world feels darker than ever. Even as we retreat to our homes, and wear masks in public - we do not have to be alone. Aside from the many communal activities we have planned for our congregation, I share with you some ideas - ways you can bring light into your world, and into the world of those around you.

Where to Light

To best publicize the miracle, the Hanukkah menorah ("Hanukkiah") is ideally lit outside the doorway of our house, on the left side when entering. If this is not practical, then the menorah should be lit in a window facing the public thoroughfare. If the menorah cannot be lit by the window, place it inside the house on a table,



which at least fulfills the mitzvah of "publicizing the miracle" for members of the household.

When to Light

The menorah should preferably be lit immediately at nightfall. If necessary, however, the menorah can be lit late into the night. It is best to wait until all members of the household are present to light the menorah.

How to Light on the First Night

On the first night, place one candle in the menorah's far right (as you face the menorah) candle holder. Another candle is placed for the shamash (helper candle). Recite all three of the blessings (on the next page) and then light the candle using the shamash.

How to Light on the Second Through Eighth Night

The second night, place two candles in the menorah's far right (as you face the menorah) candle holders. Another candle is placed for the shamash. Recite the first two blessings and then light the candles using the shamash. Light

the candle to the far left first and then light in order, from left to right. Follow this procedure for each night of Hanukkah.

Concluding the Hanukkah Candlelighting

On all eight nights of Hanukkah, it is traditional to sing or recite Hanerot Halalu, an ancient chant mentioned in the Talmud (Soferim 20:6). It reminds us of the sacred nature of the Hanukkah lights that are lit to commemorate and publicize the Hanukkah miracles. The song states that our sole intent in kindling the Hanukkah lights is to publicize the miracle.

We conclude the candle lighting ceremony with the singing of Maoz Tzur. The lyrics were written about 800-900 years ago in Europe. The tune that is considered to be "traditional" in most parts of the Jewish world today is an adaptation of a German folk song.

Now it's time to enjoy latkes, sufganiot (donuts), gifts and the joy of the festival that our people have celebrated in this same tradition for many centuries!

EIGHT INTERACTIVE WAYS TO MAKE EACH NIGHT OF HANUKKAH MORE SPECIAL WITH FRIENDS AND FAMILY

Just as you used Zoom on Passover or Thanksgiving to connect with family and friends around the country - use Zoom for Hanukkah. Don't light alone, and don't allow yourself to be alone. At the same time, please exercise caution. Don't allow "Covid fatigue" to open your homes in ways that are really not safe. This pandemic will not last forever and each of us can really make a difference.

1. Family History Night.

One night of Hanukkah, invite family for candle lighting. Ask older members of the family to share some of their Hanukkah memories.

2. One night, have a personal or family "check-in."

Discuss how your family maintains a strong Jewish identity. Are there times that you or your family feel torn by the demands of the secular culture? How do you manage the challenges of being a minority in a majority culture?

3. Study readings on the theme of light.

By yourself or with guests, gather all of the items, poems, writings you can which bring light into the world. Ask each person to bring one object, poem, idea or something that has brought the pleasure of light into their life. They might bring it to share and show. Or, you might decide to swap with someone else to experience light in a new form! For example, one year a friend brought a kaleidoscope, another year a beautiful sun catcher, another year a poem about light. A story about Nelson Mandela was brought by one person and that of Rabin by another, Hannah Senesh by another.

4. Israel Night.

This is where everyone brings a clipping, item or idea about the modern Maccabees and their state: Israel. The clippings would be about both amazing and challenging things that are going on in Israel or about Israel. Alternatively, perhaps you want to watch an Israeli movie or television show. I have an extensive collection and am happy to lend to anyone in the congregation.

5. On one of the nights of Hanukkah, open all of the tzedakah boxes in the house and count the money in preparation for giving to a worthy cause.

Have every person bring a clipping about a cause they believe needs funding in the most immediate way. Besides using the funds in the tzedakah box, consider setting aside money that would have been spent on gifts to support these worthy causes.

6. On another night of Hanukkah, remind yourselves of the origins of the Hanukkah story.

Either search online or call the Temple office—we have resources for you. While many of us celebrate Hanukkah yearly, the details of the story can become confusing, and it is a good idea to refresh your memory from time to time.

7. Bring light into someone's life.

No doubt you know of people in your life who are lonely or isolated. Reach out to these individuals and share the holiday with them. Donate some new, warm pajamas, socks or shoes (sizes infant - children's size 16) to our drive to help new immigrants through Jewish Family Service (details on page 2). Your donations will bring light and warmth into another person's life.

8. A long-standing practice is to silently watch the candles burn.

It is a form of Jewish meditation practiced as far back as the Talmudic period. Loosely focus your eyes on the menorah and savor the minutes of pure light. Notice what comes up for you, even after the last flame has burned out. What blessings have occurred for you during the eight nights of lights?
